Dear Friends,

January 2020

It is time to once again send you greetings for the New Year, thank you for your tremendous support and update you about our activities during the past year. May the coming year be happy and healthy for you and your loved ones, see an upturn in the condition of our people and an end to oppression all over the world. It is sad that, although the desire for peace and the well-being of mankind is a universal aspiration, it remains an elusive dream. It is left to each one of us to light a candle and remove the darkness wherever we can. With your help, SOS strives to do this and bring happiness and hope into the lives of thousands of children. May you be blessed for your concern and your generosity!

We continue to make steady progress in expanding our facilities and now have 59 projects functioning all over the country. Of these 32 are residential projects, exclusively for orphans, and the rest are community schools, technical training centres and medical dispensaries. Several projects are under construction to complete essential facilities as, along with each SOS Children's Village, we require a Youth Home where boys are moved on reaching adolescence, and a community school which ensures quality education and the opportunity to mingle with other children. With the steep escalation in construction costs the establishment of new projects has been impacted but we are gradually meeting our targets. An SOS Children's Village is under construction in Rawalakot (AJK), an SOS Children's Home in Multan and schools in Muzaffarabad and Khairpur. To complete the ancillary requirements of the existing 15 SOS Children's Villages we must also establish youth facilities in Sialkot, Jamshoro and Khairpur and schools in Jamshoro and Rawalakot. We frequently get offers of assistance inviting us to open projects in different areas, but have the capacity to admit more children in our existing projects, as well as reasonably wide geographical coverage. We presently plan to establish an SOS Children's Village in South Punjab, for which the location of Rahim Yar Khan has been selected by the Board of Governors. Any support in taking this forward will be very welcome.


Apart from the above we have decided to establish SOS Children's Homes in all the cities in which we are presently operating. As I have advised in previous newsletters, these homes are projects for children of women-headed families. This is an enormous social problem in our country as the responsibility of the children, makes it extremely difficult for the women to earn a living. Previously our criteria for admission excluded this category, as no institution can replace a mother. These new projects encourage the mothers to remain in close touch with their offspring, so that they do not feel abandoned by them. We presently have four such facilities – Lahore, Karachi, Abbottabad and Kharian - with the lattermost being purpose built and donated by a remarkable family trust – Brigadier Sahib Dad Khan Welfare Trust. The demand for admission in these homes is considerably higher than our other projects. The increased need for maintenance costs brings me to an appeal I would like to make. All these years, the rate of admission of children and the offer of sponsorships, has been more-or-less balanced. However, as a result of the accelerated admission rate, we now have many unsponsored children – currently 80. The sponsorship of one child is Rs.10,000 per month and covers the entire cost, including food, clothing and education. Please consider becoming a regular sponsor and invite others who may not be aware of this need. Please also invite anyone interested to visit one of our facilities and see for themselves how we function.

And this brings me to the exciting visit by the royal couple of which all of you will be aware. The SOS Children's Village Lahore was included in the official itinerary of Prince William and Princess Kate Middleton on their recent trip to Pakistan. They were genuinely impressed and moved by what they saw, commenting on how much they would have liked to spend more time with the children. The following day, when bad weather made it necessary to cancel their scheduled itinerary, they did just that and returned for a private visit. This was absolutely thrilling for the children with whom they chatted informally, played cricket, painted pictures and played carom. The couple was very interested in our organization; they wanted to know more about the concept and were so impressed by the SOS alumni who were introduced to them. Included were two girls, a university professor who has a Ph.D degree and another with an M.Phil Bio-chemistry who is head of the laboratory in a multinational company. A great memory for the children and a very great honour for SOS!

The absorption of our children into the mainstream is, obviously, our ultimate objective and we continue to focus attention on preparing them for this transition. More and more attention is being given to youth empowerment and the chance to develop to their full potential. Taking advantage of new technology, on-line counseling and inter-active sessions with professionals are arranged so that they are equipped with the essential skills required to become contributing members of society. Many who have passed through our hands are well settled in life and a testament to the hard work involved in their upbringing. This would not be possible without the passion and commitment brought to our work by the dedicated volunteers who serve on our committees. They not only ensure the standards of excellence which are our hallmark, but also ensure that every child indeed has a 'loving home' and a fair chance in life. I would like to extend to all of them my sincere gratitude. Words are insufficient to adequately thank them but, I am certain they are well rewarded by the satisfaction of transforming lives. Without any doubt, if we did not have the advantage of these dedicated colleagues, it would not be possible to establish and maintain centres of excellence all over the country. Many thanks also to our support groups in London, Washington and Toronto. They are doing an outstanding job in promoting our work and harnessing the goodwill of the diaspora. Their assistance, especially in funding new projects, is gratefully acknowledged. I am aware that people living abroad are keen to assist good initiatives at home and I would like to invite those interested, to consider setting up chapters in their area.

Last, but not least, my sincere thanks to you, our donors. Nothing would be possible without your support and everything we are able to do is because of your assistance. Thank you for your trust and confidence in our ability to utilize your donations judiciously and transparently. We assure you that we will continue to do so and look forward to your continued support.
